## SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER

Dear School Community Member:

I hope this newsletter finds you in the very best of health and spirit this holiday season! In this issue, I would like to update you on our improvement of instruction efforts and our progress on a potential building project.

### **What's new in our improvement of instruction efforts?**

We are nearing completion on our parent engagement strategic plan. We are aiming for a publication date in late January 2017. We are excited about this because several of our staff, students, and parents, have worked hard to identify key strategies and resources to improve how our schools engage parents in student learning.

We are developing a new partnership with Mount Saint Mary College that will expand and diversify the teacher applicant pool; increase teacher mentoring opportunities; and provide professional development opportunities for our instructional staff. Our students will also be able to explore teaching as a college course of study at Mount Saint Mary. These have been made possible through a *My Brother's Keeper Teacher Opportunity Corps* grant, that was awarded to Mount Saint Mary College.

We are also in the first full-year of implementing our Learning Technology grant. This has allowed us to provide our teachers with high-quality Google Classroom professional development, including a Google Summit which took place this past June. We have increased the number

of Chromebooks available to students and staff, as well as our internal Wi-Fi network capacity, so more students and staff can utilize Google Classroom and other learning applications to enhance student learning.

The Volunteer in the Classroom program is also new this year. The program is the brainchild of Dr. Stephanie Phillips, member of the Board of Education. This program was designed with participation from teacher suggestions to support our improvement of instruction efforts. The program is designed to connect our community members, teachers, and students. Members of the school community are invited to share their talents, skills, and life experiences with our students. Teachers have offered a variety of opportunities for new volunteers to take part in the educational experiences of our students. We are currently in the process of recruiting, selecting and interviewing volunteer candidates. We expect our new volunteers to begin working after the New Year.

### **What's happening with the building project?**

The Board of Education met on December 21<sup>st</sup> and approved a building project resolution to go before the voters on March 14<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The project includes repairs and renovations at both the elementary and junior-senior high schools. The March 14, 2017, referendum will be for a total of \$15,993,934. We are anticipating that we will receive building aid at 73.9%. What this means is that we would get about 74 cents back on each dollar spent on the building project. This building aid ratio may increase in the 2017-18 school year.

### **Highlights of the repairs and renovations at the Jr/Sr HS include but are not limited to:**

- ADA compliance
- Toilet room renovations
- Pool renovations
- Gymnasium improvements
- Outdoor track and site improvements
- HVAC upgrades

### **Highlights of the repairs and renovations at BCES include but are not limited to:**

- ADA compliance
- Toilet room renovations
- HVAC upgrades

There is also SMART Bond money that the school has been given by the state that will be used for security and safety improvements. The SMART bond money will allow for \$1,722,454 of work which is at no cost to the taxpayers. The work will include:

- Security improvements at both the elementary and Jr/Sr HS in terms of new visitor entry to the buildings.
- Hardening of Corridors in both buildings which means that there will be new sets of doorways placed in various hallways to limit access to the buildings.
- Door replacements in the classrooms of both buildings that will improve safety relative to classroom access.

At this time, I would like to wish the school community a happy and healthy holiday season. I wish us all the things we wish for ourselves.

### BCES Parent/Teacher Conferences

Twice during the academic year, parents and teachers at BCES meet during the afternoon of a half-day school session to discuss the child's progress and answer questions. These opportunities are a special part of the school district's on-going initiative to encourage parent engagement with the school.

Ms. Debbie Jacobsen, who directs the After-School Kids Club Program, invited various public agencies and health-related services to set up information tables for parents and families in the school gymnasium. 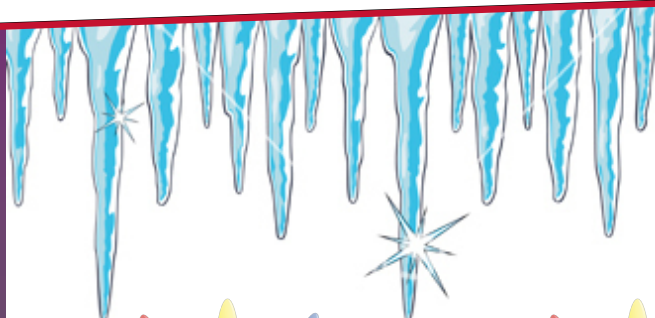
