The budget stayed underneath the tax levy cap while still allowing for a sustained program of studies and the addition of supports for the improvement of instruction efforts that are continuing.

In terms of the building project, we will be breaking ground immediately following our June graduation. Initially, there will be roofing work done at the junior-senior high school and flooring work to be completed at BCES. As a result of the facilities work, school grounds (indoors and outdoors) will not be available for use by outside groups for the next two summers. I apologize for any inconvenience this may cause. Once the project is complete, our school district facilities will be available as they have always been.

This is a very special class of young men and women who are prepared to show the world what they've got! We are very proud of our 2014 graduates and we will be following their accomplishments as they leave our hallowed halls, diploma in hand and step into the world of tomorrow.

#### **Fallsburg High School Honors Joe LaRuffa**

June 29<sup>th</sup>, 2014 was a special day for the Town of Fallsburg. The Class of 2014 received their diplomas and Joe LaRuffa entered the Fallsburg Central School District Hall of Fame as its second member. Joining last year's inaugural inductee and fellow high school teacher colleague Jack Leshner, Joe LaRuffa had an illustrious career and made a lasting impact on the Town of Fallsburg.

After three years of service in the United States Army during WW II, Mr. LaRuffa studied music education and received a BA degree

from NYU and a Master of Arts from Columbia. In 1954, he began an eventful thirty years of teaching music and performing as Band Director at FCSD. During this period he served as Town Councilman and Deputy Supervisor for 17 years; eleven years as Secretary of Hurleyville Fire Department; two years as NY State Music Association Executive Council member; and over forty years as fundraiser for the school district's Irving Hertz Scholarship that later became the Hertz-LaRuffa Scholarship.


Mr. LaRuffa brought local, state, and national recognition to the Fallsburg High School Band. In twenty-two national competitions, the band earned A and A+ ratings in twenty-one. In 1965 at the first commencement ceremony for Sullivan Community College, the college president requested that Mr. LaRuffa and his outstanding band perform. On August 19<sup>th</sup> of the following year, the band earned a rare privilege by being selected to play before President Lyndon Baines Johnson at the dedication of the new Ellenville Community Hospital.

Outstanding achievements and honors to him and the band tell only a part of the story behind Mr. LaRuffa's election into the Fallsburg Hall of Fame. He was a wonderful educator, a dedicated public servant, a mentor to thousands of students and colleagues, and a man who made a difference in the lives of those that he touched.

Robert Kaplan, Fallsburg graduate and long-time businessman, remembers his former music teacher in these words: "If I were asked who other than my parents, influenced my life the most, I would say without hesitation it was Mr. LaRuffa. He allowed all students to reach their personal best by constantly teaching that it takes hard work and practice to accomplish your goals."

Another of Mr. LaRuffa's students, who later became a long-time colleague at Fallsburg High School, Andrew Neiderman, sees him in every sense "an embodiment of what a teacher should be." When Mr. Neiderman thinks about the school community, in his mind Mr. LaRuffa is "Mr. Fallsburg."

Fifty-eight years ago, a fourth grade student's father made a bet with Mr. LaRuffa that he could not "reach" his baseball loving and New York Yankees fanatical son. The music teacher accepted the challenge and began weekly clarinet lessons to the kid for \$4.00. Jeffrey Feldman, now partner in a Fishkill law firm, was that young boy. He says that this was the best money his parents could ever have spent. Meeting Mr. LaRuffa changed his life. "He made us believe in ourselves and proved to us that in band (and, as we would later learn, more importantly in life) that there was nothing that we couldn't achieve if we put our minds to it."
