Building Project Update

We have received notice that our building project application to the State Education Department has been accepted and we are officially in the expedited queue for approval. This means that we are right on schedule to go out to bid in February with anticipated bid awards to take place in the month of March. Construction will begin this coming June.

The building project work will take place over the next two summers (2018 and 2019). Because of this work, our district-wide facilities will be closed for public use during the summers of 2018 and 2019. I apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.

Anti-bullying Efforts

This year marks the 6th anniversary of our formal and ongoing anti-bullying efforts. On October 7, 2011, the Fallsburg Central School District collaborated with the Sullivan County Cares Coalition in a training program on bullying called Olweus. The Olweus Bullying Prevention Program is an international program researched by Clemson University and has made a positive difference in schools around the world. The training involved teachers, a school resource officer, maintenance and cafeteria personnel as well as the Rolling V Bus Company.

This important training came at a time when anti-bullying efforts were more important than ever. In person bullying, cyber-bullying, texting, sexting, using the rumor mill and whatever other forms of bullying existed then (and now) take away from a student's ability

to focus on his or her education. Recognizing the importance of eradicating bullying at all levels, the Fallsburg Central School District decided to say "NO" to all forms of bullying.

Now, six years later, our commitment to anti- bullying is as strong as it ever has been. Because we realize that anti-bullying efforts must be ongoing we have continued to underscore its importance with staff development for all employees and class meetings with all students. Additionally, we are bringing in a special anti-bullying program for all staff, students, parents and community members in February. The program, called Sweethearts and Heroes, will underscore the vigilance that we must continue to have since bullying continues to exist at many levels. It will be a school community-wide effort to fight the scourge of bullying. More information on this special program will be coming out in the next few weeks.

We have also established an online reporting system. The School Messenger "Quick Tip" report can be accessed from our homepage; www.fallsburgcsd.net. Our administrators will receive any complaint through this, and act promptly to address it. It also bears repeating that our Dignity Act Coordinators are the principals: Ms. Mary Kate Stinehour, at Benjamin Cosor Elementary School, and Mr. Michael Williams, at Fallsburg Jr.-Sr. High School.

I am very proud of our staff and students for their hard work on our anti-bullying efforts.

On behalf of the Board of Education, I would like to extend my best wishes to the Fallsburg School Community as we welcome 2018!


Once the band had departed the ris-

Kindergarten Classes Make Gingerbread **Houses for the Holidays**


Maybe famous architect Frank Lloyd Wright began his career by building a gingerbread house as a small child.

Aided by dozens of volunteer parents, teachers and aides,



Happy New Year! I hope that everyone had a relaxing, peaceful holiday season and the New Year brings a promise of great things to come! As the school year flies by, I am impressed more and more each day with your children and the hard work they are doing in school. Our athletic teams have been very successful thus far this year, our musicians and thespians are providing outstanding performances, and community service by our students is at an all-time high!

With the New Year also comes the beginning of preparation for the state exam requirements that many of your children will be facing. Whether your child is in the middle school or the high school, they will be required to take a state assessment. In the middle school, students will be taking math, and ELA exams. All middle school students are required to take these exams. The schedule is slightly different this year and these tests will now be offered in

April and early May. In the high school, many students will be taking Regents exams later in the spring. These Regents exams are required for graduation and are taken at various points throughout your child's high school years (grades 9-12). The State Education Department closely monitors each student's performance on these exams. Every student must pass at least five Regents exams with a 65 or better.

As a parent, there are steps you can take to help your child be successful in whatever exam they might be required to take. First, it is important that every student get a good night's sleep prior to the test. Each student should be alert and focused in the morning to do their very best. Secondly, each child should have a good breakfast on the morning of the test. If your child eats breakfast at school, we will be sure that they are well nourished before beginning. Lastly, you can stress the importance of these exams to your child. We do not want

to create stress for any student worrying about the test. Rather, we want our students to be committed to doing their best in any exam, most especially these state exams. Be sure to remind your child(ren) to take every advantage of the exam prep we offer our students, including the Fallsburg After-School program and specific Regents prep classes as the year moves along.
