SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER

Dear School Community Member:

I hope this issue of the Comet newsletter finds you in the best of health and spirit as summer is finally arriving. In this issue of the newsletter I will update you on our budget vote and board election as well as the upcoming building project.

I would like to begin by thanking the school community for approving our 2018-19 budget and for allowing us to move forward with a capital reserve fund so that we can fix our parking lots in the future. The capital reserve fund that was voter-approved in May will allow us to save some money each year, so that we can put forward a future parking lot project at no additional cost to taxpayers. This process will take a few years. What do we do with our damaged parking lots between now and then? We realize that our myriad potholes and cracked parking lots are an issue of immediate concern. To that end, the board has asked me to put together an interim solution to address the current parking lot problems. During the last week of June, it is our plan to have the most problematic areas of the parking lot (potholes, cracks, etc.) fixed. While this isn't a permanent solution, it will allow for safer travel as we await a future parking lot project.

Building Project Update

Work on the capital project is set to begin right after graduation. The capital project will now be taking place over the next three summers as opposed to taking place over two summers. The reason for this extension is because of a 16-18 month State Education Department approval process for projects using Smart Bonds Act monies. The Smart Schools Bond Act was passed in the 2014-15 Enacted Budget and approved by the voters in a state-wide referendum. The Smart Schools Bond Act (SSBA) authorized the issuance of bonds to finance improved educational technology and infrastructure to improve learning and opportunity for students throughout New York State. Fallsburg decided to use our allotted monies for district-wide security upgrades.

The Smart Schools Bond Act requires that each Smart Schools Investment Plan (SSIP) be thoroughly reviewed and approved by the Smart Schools Review Board prior to a district bidding, contracting, or expending any SSBA funds. This process is taking up to 18 months currently. As a result, we had to move the security upgrades phase to the summer of 2020.

Phase 1 of our building project will take place this summer and will focus on the repair and renovations of the junior-senior high school gymnasium. **Phase 2** will take place in the summer of 2019. Those repairs and renovations will include but not be limited to the repair and renovation of the swimming pool and converting the remaining steam heat portions of the building to hot water. Finally, **Phase 3** will take place in the summer of 2020. This phase will involve all the security upgrades to the district which include security vestibules in both buildings and the replacement of doors in both buildings.

I would also like to take this opportunity to congratulate and welcome our newest member of the Board of Education, Mr. Sean Wall-Carty. Sean was voted in to office this past May and will assume the role of Board Member July 1st. Retiring after nearly two decades of school board service is Shawn Wiles. Shawn has served this school community with grace, honor, drive, and a genuine love for the students at FCSD. Shawn will be greatly missed, and I know we all wish him the best of everything in his future.

Finally, I would like to congratulate the FCSD graduating class of 2018. This class graduated on June 24th, 2018, and begins the next chapter soon following that celebration. On behalf of the Board of Education and the Fallsburg Central School District, I wish this year's graduates everything they wish for themselves in the precious moments to come.

Wellness Day Focuses on Good Health

Wednesday, May 9th, 2018, was a special day at BCES. In collaboration with Cornell Cooperative Extension

of Sullivan County (CCE), the Wellness Committee (WC) of Fallsburg Central School District (FCSD) engaged the entire school in a dynamic display of well-being and good healthy practices. All activities occurred outside in front of the building.

Wellness Day was a hands-on activity, enrolling teachers, staff, volunteers, and, most of all the young people beginning at 10 AM for Pre-K children and ending at 2 PM with 5th graders. The schedule included all grades based on lunch times.

Events involved social, emotional, intellectual, occupational, nutritional, environmental, physical, and spiritual health. The first activity was based on nutrition and exercise with two huge 20 foot diameter parachutes provided by CCE and organized by Bee Moser and SueAnn Boyd. Children, teachers and aides grabbed hold and exercised by shaking the material, by running under it and back out, while everyone laughed with joy. Even WC member and Superintendent Dr. Ivan Katz took a turn as one of the holders and shakers.

Successive classes moved from the nutritional parachutes and entered a seven part physical activity course containing hurdles, stretching, relay running, throwing balls, and related movements instructed by Dave Luczynski, Jennie Verdi and Leah Exner. Across the driveway, children met Jennie Kohler and Kate Santoianni for **Yoga4classrooms** poses while learning useful breathing techniques to help them relax and get centered in their bodies.

While all this activity was underway and each class flowed through their twenty minute sequences, WC members in the school kitchen Suzanne Lenzian, Ilene Wizwer, Renee Kates, and Arlene Hussey were peeling, cutting and preparing small cups of fresh cantaloupe, snap peas and kiwis under the guidance of WC member and SC BOCES Food Service Manager Dara Smith. As students entered the cafeteria, each child received a serving of the three items just prior to taking their lunch.

Documenting the events were WC members Colleen Emery and Larry Schafman. At 2 PM, the WC enjoyed a healthy lunch and shared the success of the day and what they would do next year. The dozens of photos revealed a couple hundred children, teachers and staff enjoying a morning of fun, sunshine, good healthy activity and nourishment for the mind and body.

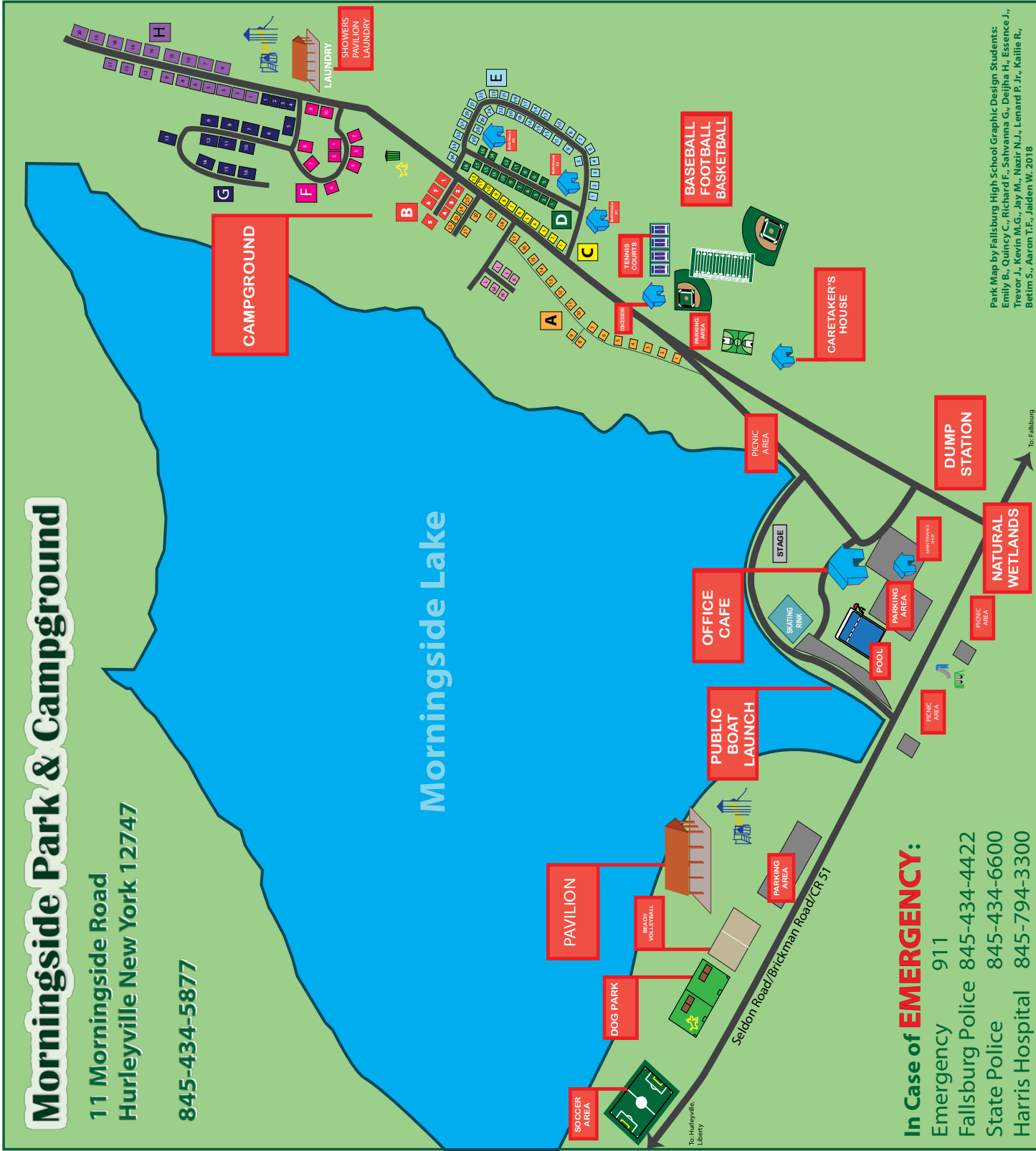
- ### Vehicle and Parking Rules
- You are limited to 4 people, one vehicle and RV or tent per site. Unless your receipt indicates otherwise, you must occupy the site that is issued to you.
 - No mini bikes, ATVs or snowmobiles are allowed in the park. If a golf cart is needed for health reasons it may be allowed with park manager approval. Motorized scooters must be licensed and registered with the park office. Riders must wear helmets and be at least 16 years of age. Hoverboards are not permitted in the parks.
 - Observe all posted speed limits and signs. The park speed limit is 10 mph.

- ### Park Rules
- Quiet time is between 11pm and 9am
Any and all noise is to be limited to your site at all times.
Please respect your neighbors.
- All visitors must leave by 9pm. There is a limit of two visitors at a time per site.
 - Pavilion, playground and ball fields are closed after 9pm, unless organized park activities are in progress in those areas. There is a 10pm curfew for children under 18 years of age. Children must be at their sites at that time unless accompanied by an adult.
 - All vehicles in camping or seasonal sites must have current car tags. Violators will be towed at owner's expense. No bike riding after dark.

- ### Site Rules
- Please help us keep the campground clean and safe for your enjoyment.
- Lighting and electrical wires are not permitted on trees and bushes. It is limited to your trailers, fences, and walkways. Lighting must be confined to your site and must not infringe on your neighbors.
 - Do not dismantle or make any new fire rings. We are trying to lessen the environmental impact. Campfires must be reasonable and safe.
 - Firearms and other weapons (including paintball and BB guns) as well as chainsaws, fireworks, portable electric heaters and washing machines are not permitted in the campground.
 - Pets are permitted but must be kept on a leash. Even friendly pets can scare strangers. Please clean up after your dogs and keep them from barking excessively, especially at night.
 - Construction of unsightly structures (as defined by the park management), including fencing is prohibited. All structures must be pre-approved by the park supervisor. All structures must conform to the Town of Fallsburg building codes. The park reserves the right to remove any non-approved structures at the owner's expense.
 - When you leave your site for an extended period of time or retire for the evening, fires must be extinguished.
 - Please do not deface or cut any trees or deface or misuse the park facilities.
 - Anything and everything you bring in to your campsite must be taken when you leave.
 - Insubordinate behavior towards our staff will not be tolerated and may result in dismissal from the park and or prosecution by local authorities.

There will be no refunds.
Any violation of the above rules and regulations may result in termination of the privilege to camp in our park without refund, by order of the Town Board of the Town of Fallsburg.

The Town of Fallsburg and/or Park Management reserves the right to evict anyone found breaking our rules, nonpayment, defacing, causing a nuisance and/or disturbing other guests. Comments or questions can be directed to the Park Manager.
