SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER



Dear School Community Member:

I hope this issue of the Comet Newsletter finds you in the very best of health and spirit. I have a few updates for you:

Building Project

This past summer's building project work is substantially completed. Our long-awaited pool re-opening will take place in the near future. At this time, we are preparing for the final leg of our building project which will take place this coming summer. This summer we will have school safety upgrades which will add safety measures to both our buildings. These safety measures include door replacements district-wide and new building entryways.

School Budget

The 2021-2022 school budget season is underway. There are several budget workshops scheduled at our upcoming board meetings (these meetings are advertised). The board expects to approve a budget at the April 7, 2021, board meeting in preparation for the budget vote which will take place on Tuesday, May 18, 2021. The board budget committee has been meeting on a regular basis to plan for a school budget in these unprecedented and challenging times. The overarching goal continues to be balancing the needs of the District with the capacity of our taxpayers. We encourage our public to attend the upcoming budget workshops and to vote on May 18, 2021.

COVID-19 Vaccination Update

I want to share an update with you on the status of vaccinations in Sullivan County for educators and educational workers.

We have been working with the Sullivan County Public Health Department and Sullivan County BOCES in terms of preparing for our staff to get vaccinated in the near future. Public Health has already begun administering vaccinations to Sullivan County School Districts.

Public Health began the process by piloting vaccination clinics in two of the smaller districts in the county (Roscoe and Livingston Manor) - to test their registration system and vaccination proto-

cols. Things went smoothly in those two districts, setting the stage for administering vaccinations to the larger districts.

How are districts being prioritized for vaccinations?

Previously, Sullivan County BOCES met with the Director of Public Health and the County Manager relative to planning for the vaccination protocols. It was decided that available vaccinations would be prioritized based on the rate of infection throughout the county.

Based on the county data, Monticello, Liberty, and Fallsburg would be vaccinated first as they had the highest number of infections in the county with Monticello ranked as the highest, followed by Liberty and then Fallsburg. Monticello CSD is in the process of getting vaccinated as we speak. Liberty will be second to receive vaccinations, followed by Fallsburg.

The county is looking to ramp up its ability to administer more vaccines as they become available. They are going to request more doses every week as they scale up their efforts. I am hopeful from my correspondence with SC BOCES and Public Health that these efforts will drive more vaccines to our area and, ultimately, to Fallsburg.

The vaccination plans described above are predicated on vaccine availability. The vaccines, as you may know, are currently in short supply. So, it may take several weeks for the process to move forward through each of the districts.

I would like to thank the school community for continuing to work with us during this pandemic as we make the best of the most difficult and challenging time in the history of American education. May the future bring us the best of everything and a quick and healthy return to normalcy, whatever the new normal may look like.

Warrior Kids Return to FCSD

With the arrival of the pandemic and remote learning in March 2020, Fallsburg Central School District (FCSD) has altered or temporarily lost many programs both in-classroom and after school. One of the most special programs was Warrior Kids. Brought to FCSD and a few other Sullivan County schools by Cornell Cooperative Extension of Sullivan and Orange

Counties (CCE) and Garnet Health Medical Center-Catskills (GHMC-C), hundreds of children

enrolled in this after-school program. Because the program focused on healthy eating and rigorous exercise, the sponsors wanted to revive it at a time of great need for the

school children. They also added a mental health component to promote well-being during the challenges of the pandemic.

CCE and GHMC-C welcomed the Warrior kids Program back to FCSD in January as a pilot hybrid program. Ms. Moira Mencher, Manager of Physician Relations & Community

Health at Garnet Health, did a wonderful job in managing and coordinating the entire program. Two hundred and six, 5th, and 6th graders participated for four weeks, three days a week, with two classes every Wednesday, Thursday and Friday from 2 PM to 3:30 PM.

Benjamin Cosor Elementary School (BCES) physical education teacher Vanessa Marsilio led a group in each period on campus in a classroom. CCE's Nutritionist Bee Moser and Warriors' trainer Damola Akinyemi performed the healthy foods and exercise elements from their homes via Google Meet for all the students in Ms. Marsilio's classroom and in their homes.

Everyone was delighted at the response of children, parents and FCSD Administration. FCSD Athletics Director and Chair of the Wellness Committee Suzanne Lenzian was very happy.

Al Rasnick Do the Right Thing Award Resumes at FCSD

- English Language Learners,

- McKinney Vento students?

In this issue, we are focusing on McKinney Vento students who are students living in temporary housing arrangements and/or whose housing is uncertain.

Are you unsure if your child's housing would be considered temporary? Please review the examples listed below for further information.

Is your child currently:

- Sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason

- Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodations
- Living in an emergency or transitional shelter
- Abandoned in hospitals
- Living in a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings
- Living in a car, park, public space, abandoned building, substandard housing, bus or train station, or similar setting

Migratory youth:

After reviewing the aforementioned examples, if you are uncertain whether your child's housing would be considered temporary, please contact me to discuss your specific circumstances.

Please know that our conversation will remain confidential and that I am here to help you.

Please also rest assured that you are not alone in that there are other families who are in similar living situations. The goal of our conversation will be to put you in touch with resources to help you ensure that your child's basic needs are met. I look forward to working with you and your child.

Fallsburg Alumni News

The Fallsburg Alumni Association is proud to present its first ever Lawrence Kotin Award. This award recognizes and honors a Fallsburg Alumni whose dedication and contributions on behalf of children with special needs is outstanding.

Lawrence Kotin graduated FCHS in 1958. He earned a B.A. from Columbia College in 1962, a Certificat de Langue Francaise from La Sorbonne, and a J.D. from the Columbia University School of Law in 1966. He has had an outstanding legal career and has won awards for his advocacy for students with special needs. He drafted much of the Massachusetts legislation outlining the rights of children with disabilities and was instrumental in its passage in 1972. He later drafted the regulations from that statute and was a consultant to the Department of Education in the first years of the law's implementation. This legislation became the federal Education for All Handicapped Children Act three years later. This award is to honor and remember his lifetime of work on behalf of children with special needs.

The Fallsburg Alumni Association has chosen **Mrs. Regina McKenny-Snead** to be the recipient of this honor and award. Regina is a 1989 graduate of FCSD. In Regina's words, *"I always knew that my purpose in life was to be of service to others... I am extremely proud to be a part of what is now known as The Arc Greater Hudson Valley. I appreciate being deeply rooted in an organization that promotes, among other things, advocacy, inclusion and independence for people with developmental disabilities."* Regina has dedicated most of her career to SullivanArc and was promoted into her current position as Associate Executive Director of SullivanArc in 2007. The FAA is delighted to have Regina, who is the current President of the FAA, as its recipient of this new and well-deserved award.
