## From the Interim High School Principal

#### Hybrid News

On November 30, 2020, we will return to school under a hybrid model. Students in the Jr./Sr. High School will physically be present in the building for two days and will learn remotely the other three days. There will be two cohorts. The A cohort will attend in person on Monday and Tuesday, while the B will attend in person on Thursday and Friday. The school day will change from the 9:30-2:30 schedule to the pre-Covid "normal" schedule of 7:51-2:38. **THIS SCHEDULE WILL GO INTO EFFECT ON NOVEMBER 23**. We will use the new schedule remotely for the two days before Thanksgiving to help everyone acclimate to the transition.

#### New Faces

Effective November 23,2020, the Jr./Sr. High School will have new leadership. Ms. Charlotte Gregory will be taking over as the new interim principal until a permanent replacement can be found. Ms. Gregory has been an administrator in several Sullivan County schools including Fallsburg where she served as the interim superintendent before Dr. Katz.

Approximately fifty children and adults in the South Fallsburg area were gifted with new winter coats, hats, gloves, and boots donated to Fallsburg Central School District by Assemblywoman Aileen Gunther. Ironically, Kristen Meyer, guidance secretary, and Dr. Aleta Lymon, Family and Community Liaison had already compiled a list of families that were in need. These large families were selected for the coats based on requests from parents for food, clothing and other items that were also donated by Fallsburg staff. Assistant Principal, Shana Bruestle; Director of Athletics, Suzanne Lendzian; and Dr. Lymon organized the coats by sizes. The coats were delivered to the families the same day. According to Dr. Lymon, the need is still great. The loss of jobs earlier in the year due to the pandemic has caused a lot of hardship for families who were already living from paycheck-to-paycheck. Everyone's situation is different. The families were incredibly grateful for the assistance. If anyone is still in need, please contact the high school office.

## From the Elementary Principal

As we prepare for our start in a hybrid (a mixture of in-person and remote learning) model, we would like to remind our families of the importance of maintaining and supporting a healthy approach to stopping the spread of contagions.

#### Temperature checks:

Each morning, prior to your child heading off to school, we strongly encourage parents/guardians to take your child's temperature. If your child has an elevated temperature (close to 100°), you must keep him/her at home.

When your child arrives at school, we will be taking his/her temperature. If your child has an elevated temperature (close to 100°) he/she will NOT be allowed to enter the main building. Your child will be escorted to a designated area and you will be called to immediately pick your child up.

#### Hand washing:

If you haven't already done so, please model and practice with your child appropriate hand washing. Your child should be washing his/her hands before going to school and immediately upon returning home from school.

Children should be encouraged to keep their hands/fingers away from their face, especially their eyes, nose, and mouth. We can all agree that the health and well-being of your child and all the children in our community are our number one priority. We must be sure that children who are showing signs of illness, including those who have a temperature remain home so we can minimize the risk of spreading any infectious disease.

We are looking forward to seeing our children soon! We wish you and your family the best of health!

Hello everyone!

As I write this article, it is with the understanding that, beginning on Monday, November 30<sup>th</sup>, the students will be back at school! Mrs. Stinehour and I are very excited and are looking forward to welcoming everyone back!

However, I have to remind everyone that, while we are eager to see everyone, we must remember that we have to maintain our COVID-19 Social Distancing Protocols.

#### We must remember to:

- Maintain a six-foot distance from each other.
  - We have set up the classrooms to ensure that everyone stays a safe distance from each other. The desks are six (6) feet apart, and, in most classrooms, there is a two (2)-foot wide walking/passing aisle between the students' desk areas.
  - Wash our hands frequently.
    Teachers will remind the students that they (the students) need to wash their hands many times a day.
    It is especially important for the students to wash before and after they eat their breakfast and lunch.
- Refrain from sharing our food and drinks.
- We all like to share. It's fun to trade lunches. However, in this time, during which we are battling the spread of an infectious disease, it is so very important to keep instances of close interactions to a minimum. Therefore, we need to eat our own food.

The 2020-21 school year is off to a successful start. Through the Covid-19 pandemic, the Fallsburg community has come together to support our students in amazing ways. School staff have found new ways to make connections to our students, parents, and families through the use of technology. Students, parents, and families have risen to the occasion to meet the challenges remote learning presents.

Students have been participating in their live Google Meets with school staff with increased success as they become more accustomed to remote learning. We have learned that schedules are very helpful to keep track of the numerous sessions students participate in on any given day. If you have questions regarding your son/daughter's schedule or need assistance creating their schedule, please contact your child's special education teacher.

Special education staff have been meeting with students through live Google Meets since the beginning of the school year to ensure our students have access to their specialized instruction. Related services such as speech/language therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, and psychological counseling services also meet with students through Google Meets. It is extremely important that students participate in their specialized instruction, as well as their related services, so they can continue to progress in all their Individualized Education Plan (IEP) goals For our special education students who are due for reevaluation testing, school staff will be reaching out to parents to schedule an individual testing session in accordance with all health and safety protocols. We greatly appreciate you making your child available for testing, as this will enable us to better meet our student's needs. Subsequent reevaluation Committee of Special Education meetings will be scheduled and held through Google Meets. Parents will continue to receive a meeting invitation as well as a phone call in advance of the meeting with the details on how to participate in the meeting via phone or computer.

We want to express our appreciation to our parents who have truly stepped in and stepped up to support their children in remote learning. As parents ourselves, we realize that remote learning adds one more responsibility to an already full plate. The fact that your son/daughter is doing well, is no doubt, in large part, because of YOU!

## A Special Diploma for a Special Woman

Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction, Dr. Sally Sharkey, drove up to Albany to the home of Ms. Rhodesia Jones on the evening of September 16, 2020. She was bringing her a high school graduation diploma from Fallsburg Central School District. A former student in the District, Rhodesia was unable to complete her secondary education because she chose to serve in the United States Armed Forces during the Gulf War from 1996-2003. She was one of the first female truck drivers in her assignment.

In accordance with Section 29C of the New York State Education Law, the Commissioner of Education is required to develop a program whereby any veteran of the armed forces who has served on active duty, and who was unable, for any reason, to complete a secondary education, may be awarded a high school diploma based on knowledge and experience gained while in service. Proudly, Dr. Sharkey telephoned into the virtual Board of Education meeting to introduce Ms. Jones and turned the program over to Superintendent Dr. Ivan Katz.

Dr. Katz said, "Dear members of the Board of Education, as Superintendent of Schools, it is my honor and great pleasure to present to you the newest graduate of the Fallsburg Central School District, Rhodesia Jones. Thank you for your service to our country and to this school district. Fallsburg is proud of you and your accomplishments. You are an inspiration to all Fallsburg Graduates."

Dr. Sharkey presented Ms. Jones the diploma. You can

see how happy she is to earn this honor in the attached photo, smiling and in her cap and gown. The Board members and the Superintendent shared in the graduate's happiness on this memorable evening. Can you imagine how much joy Dr. Sharkey must have felt during the ride up and back from Albany? It was an evening that everyone participating will never forget.
