SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER



Dear School Community Member:

I would like to take a moment and welcome you back for the start of the 2021-22 school year! The summer, as usual, is flying by at light speed and here we are, hopefully re-energized to meet and greet a **brand new** school year.

Building Project Update

The final phase of our building project is underway this summer with our security upgrades taking the center stage. Please excuse our appearance as we prepare to have everything ready for the opening of school. Upon project completion you will see security vestibules at the entrances of both of our buildings. In addition to the vestibules, we are replacing most of the doors in both of our buildings. These security upgrades are being done to protect the health, safety and welfare of our students, staff, and visitors.

Pandemic Update

We do have a number of challenges ahead of us as the specter of COVID-19 continues with new variants making their way into our county and our school district. Our current infection rate in the county has skyrocketed and our vaccination rate has not. We are working on our reopening plans and currently look forward to bringing all our kids back in for in-person instruction. More details will follow as we finalize our reopening plans. There will also be reopening plan presentations for BCES and the Junior-Senior High School prior to the opening of school. Once these dates and times have been chosen, we will notify parents and guardians so that they can attend and participate.

Special Funding Opportunities for FCSD

This summer we finalized plans on how to spend unexpected funds (ARP and ESSER) to support our district (something we've never had before). We got great feedback on how to spend our funds from students, parents, staff, administration, and board members. While the list of what we're getting is substantial, here are a few things that were decided on:

- 1) Air conditioning district-wide (except for the gyms and cafeterias because they are too big).
- 2) ELA, math, and social work support for kids
- 3) A storage facility to reclaim lost storage space due to the pool renovation
- 4) Additional field trips and SEL school community events
- 5) Relocatable classroom spaces to support students and our educational programs

This promises to be an exciting year at many levels (even with the unpredictability of the COVID-19 variants).

I would like to thank all members of our school community for supporting our school district! I look forward to welcoming everyone for the 2021-22 school year. I hope you are able to make the most of the remaining days of summer! Enjoy!

From the Elementary Principal

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome our students, families, and staff to the 2021-22 school year! We hope that you and your family enjoyed your summer and are looking forward to a new year of learning. Although we are still navigating through the constantly changing world around us, we are ready to begin our school year full-time, fully "in person". "Remote only learning" will not be offered this year.

This summer has been spent preparing for the return of all our students and staff. Our custodial staff have been quite busy cleaning, organizing, and setting up our buildings. Our food service providers have prepared meals for our students not only throughout the school year while in a "hybrid" model, but throughout the summer. Our bus drivers have been busy delivering those meals throughout our community. This year, since we will be fully "in person, meals will only be served to students in school. Our office staff has supported families throughout the summer; answering questions; providing needed documents and informing families of the upcoming school year guidance.

In addition to all the inner workings of our school, our building has been abuzz with construction crews. A new safety and security vestibule is being built at our main entrance. New classroom doors and safety doors throughout the building are being installed as well.

Our staff has spent the summer familiarizing themselves with our new math and reading programs. Both curricula are aligned with the Next Generation standards. In addition to our new math and reading programs, we will be piloting a social-emotional learning curriculum entitled Positive Action. This, in conjunction with PBIS and Olweus will support the social-emotional learning needs of our students as they return to school, full time since the start of the pandemic.

Although many of our students returned to the school building last year, we understand that many of our students remained "remote" and the transition back to the school building will be concerning for not only our students, but for our families as well. Please know that safety and mitigation measures are in place to help reduce the

spread of contagions. Below are just a few of those mitigation measures:

- Temperature checks of students and staff upon entering the building.
- Hand-sanitizing stations in every classroom.
- Additional hand-washing stations in every wing.
- Mandatory indoor mask-wearing of all students and staff, regardless of vaccination status. (Including on our buses.)
- Mask breaks outdoors, as often as possible.
- Disinfection of high-touch surfaces throughout the day.
- Nightly disinfection of all surfaces and rooms.

As you can see, we are ready to begin our school year. The safety of our children and families in our community are our number one priority. On behalf of the BCES staff, we are excited to begin another year of learning and growing together!

July 17, 2021 was a very special day in the history of Fallsburg Central School District. The Fallsburg Alumni Association (FAA) held its annual reunion and presentation of special awards to graduating seniors, alumni, and former staff members from the school district. The FCSD was also inducting four new members into the school's Hall of Fame (HOF), including three from last year's canceled ceremony.

Host FAA President Regina McKenny-Snead began the FAA Awards with Staff Honorees Nurse Lonnie Lindsey and BCES teacher Leah Exner. Alumnus Awards went to Lisa McAdoo and Stanley Gilmore. Graduating Seniors receiving FAA Awards were Ava Anderman, Haddy Gai, Daniel Milov, Jamie Rein, and Janelly Santos Lopez.

The Sheryl Kalter Memorial Award for outstanding citizenship and community service went to Daniel Milov and Gabrielle Pantel. The Robynne Anderman Award presented by her Mom and Board of Education Member Arlene Anderman Hussey went to her great niece, Ava Anderman.

Eileen Kalter presented the FAA Jack Leshner Award to Dolce McPherson. The final honor was to Regina McKenny-Snead - the first ever recipient of the Lawrence Kotin Award. For many years Ms. McKenny-Snead has been an executive leader of Sullivan Arc, now known as The Arc Greater Hudson Valley. The Lawrence Kotin Award was established for Mr. Kotin's dedication and contributions on behalf of children with special needs. A 1958 FCHS graduate, Mr. Kotin himself received several awards during his lifetime for advocacy for students with special needs.

FCSD Superintendent Dr. Ivan Katz hosted the Hall of Fame inductions. Honoree Dr. Jamiene Studley joined the ceremony remotely. She was especially honored that the event was in the school where her grandfather Benjamin Cosor devotedly served for over thirty years on the BOE. She served in the administration of

three U.S. Presidents, Carter, Clinton and Obama. In the latter service, she was the Deputy Secretary of the Education Department.

Dr. Myra Young Armstead was the next inductee. After receiving a PhD. in History, Myra Young Armstead taught American History and received honors from organizations throughout the world. She has pioneered efforts in the field of education for women in prisons. Currently, she is Associate Professor of History and Vice President for Academic Inclusive Excellence at Bard College.

The third HOF honoree of the day was Dr. Louis Lemberger, an MD and a PhD. His daughter, Margo Lemberger, received the award for her late father. Dr. Lemberger discovered and developed many life-saving drugs, including the anti-depressant Prozac, the first drug of its kind. Later he helped develop the anti-psychotic Zyprexa, the anti-emetic Cesamet, and Permax for treatment of Parkinson's disease. Wherever he went, said his daughter, people would shake his hand and tearfully thank him for the drug that saved the life of a close family member. To Louis Lemberger that was his greatest reward.

The Honored Inductee to the HOF for 2021 is Esther Grossman. Growing up in India as a teenager, Esther Lelah was a star on the Olympic track and field team. She emigrated to the United States and Sullivan County and earned a full scholarship to Brooklyn College in Physical Education. After graduation, she took a position at FCSD as a physical education teacher and coach. She became a mentor to thousands of young students over thirty years in the classroom, gymnasium and playing fields. Girls, with no sense of athletic ability heeded Ms. Grossman's words to come try out for teams and learn how to play. They later excelled in college in academics and athletics. Her dear friend up until the day she passed away and the person that nominated her for the Hall of Fame, Donna Rae Robataille, received the HOF plaque, with the blessings of the Grossman Family.

FCSD Presents Two STAR Awards Prior to End of School Year

In June, Superintendent Dr. Ivan Katz and the Board of Education honored FCSD Staff with the prestigious STAR Award that stands for Staff/Teacher Award Recognition. Benjamin Cosor Elementary School (BCES) Principal Mary Kate Stinehour and FCSD Director of Physical Education and Athletics

Suzanne Lenzian nominated BCES physical education teachers Vanessa Marsilio and Philip Motl for coming to the aid of a fourth grader during an outdoor class on June 10.

As the class was ending on this very hot day, students were lining up to re-enter the building. One of the children was in heat distress. Ms. Marsilio shouted out to Mr. Motl to monitor the rest of the class while she attended to the ill child. The two teachers created a controlled, safe environment, administered emergency first aid to the student, and notified the appropriate school personnel for further assistance. In the words on the award, "Ms. Marsilio and Mr. Motl seamlessly managed the emergency situation with courage, confidence and true professionalism. Fallsburg is thankful for these quick acting, well trained physical educators."

The second STAR Award was a recommendation from BOE member Ms. Fiorella Muscia to the Guidance Department Counselors at the Jr.-Sr. High School - Mr. Joe Levner, Ms. Sonja Ferreira and Ms. Merryl Giarrizzo. "During this pandemic year," said Ms. Muscia, "I have seen them work day and night effortlessly to provide guidance and structure to our students. The counselors provided the resilience, emotional and academic support required by circumstances this past fourteen months."



Kick-Off of Fallsburg 2021-2022 Football Program

Benjamin Cosor Elementary School (BCES) first grade teacher Dominick Scanna is passionate about several things - teaching early childhood bi-lingual education, coaching sports and the game of football. He expressed the importance of football on his own life and on the lives of the young people that he has met during his years with modified and varsity



football teams at Fallsburg when he hosted a BBQ on August 7, 2021 for parents and prospective football players at BCES Football Field.

"Football teaches us that we need each other," said Coach Scanna. "There are two types of education. One teaches us how to make a living. The other teaches us how to live." In twenty minutes, he encouraged the young kids and their parents to come out for the modified and varsity football programs. He confessed that he was not a focused student in high school, and he admitted that he had to repeat a school year before he reached high school. Once he found football, he turned his life around.

Football taught him about teamwork and effort, the ability to adjust and overcome adversity, to worry about only the things we can control, to have the will to succeed, and how to define who we are, where we are going, and how we are going to get there.

You could see that the young people and their families were inspired by the Coach's words and spirit. He then introduced his coaching staff for the upcoming season: Assistant Coach David Mellan in his second season; Modified Head Coach Patrick Sause in his 5th year, Assistant Coach Johnathan Bruno; Mr. Scanna's son Jake Scanna in his first season as Assistant Coach; and Coach Athan Zeno also in his first season.

Fallsburg JSHS Completes Sullivan Renaissance Garden Grant

During the winter of 2020, Fallsburg Jr/Sr High School Guidance Counsel Office Secretary Kristen Meyer applied for a Sullivan Renaissance Garden Grant for \$1500.

Her group of volunteers teamed with the school Ecology Club under Advisor Goranka Rogg to tend the soil outside the entrance to the school library, clean out old mulch, replace it with new mulch and plant flowers and shrubs to spruce up the entire area. The Ecology Club had obtained a separate grant. One of the requirements of both grants was receiving matching in-kind or cash donations from vendors in the area. Woodbourne Lawn & Garden made generous donations to both projects with topsoil and mulch. Manza's Nursery in Middletown provided a big discount on trees and plants for the entrance beautification.

In late June on a Saturday morning, Ms. Meyer and Ms. Rogg brought their groups together to begin the preparation for the new plantings. Included amongst the students were Maritza Rivas Joya, Samantha Medina, Isaias Argueta Hernandez, Cian Meyer, Dayanara Olan, Mike Aguilar Torres, Marcos Fuentes Hernandez, Haddy Gai, Aisha Darboe, Neema Darboe, Cyriah

Russell, and Ruth Murillo. They were joined by staff members Sharon Blake and Lisa Pacheco. Of great support for the operation were custodians Kyle Donnelly and Craig Cookingham.

In addition to the donations and grant funds, the Ecology Club raised money through the selling of discount cards. Ms. Meyer is applying for an additional grant from Sullivan Renaissance to improve other entrances to the building with perennial flowers and shrubs.
