Newly Appointed Board Member

On Wednesday, March 2, 2022, at a regular meeting of the Board of Education, Regina McKenney-Snead was appointed to become the newest member of the Fallsburg Central School District. Ms. McKenney-Snead was appointed to take the seat vacated by Ms. Katherine Rappaport. Ms. McKenney-Snead will have the seat through the next Board of Education election which will take place on May 17, 2022.

School Budget Update

The Board of Education continues working on preparing the 2022-2023 school budget for board approval in April and, ultimately for a budget vote on May 17, 2022. The board is continuing to work on balancing what students need while trying to make the tax levy as low as practicable.

Covid-19 Update

On March 2, 2022, the Governor of the State of New York, along with the New York State Department of Health lifted the mask requirement for public schools. The Fallsburg Board of Education, on March 2, 2022, passed a resolution recognizing this change. As a result, mask wearing is now optional for students, staff members and visitors.

School Budget Vote and Board of Education Election

I just wanted to remind everyone that the budget vote and board election will take place on Tuesday, May 17, 2022, from 11:00 AM – 8:00 PM in the Board of Education Meeting room at the Fallsburg Junior-Senior High School. This new location will be a safer way for the public to vote and allow the school day to continue uninterrupted.




